

Brandywine Valley Quilters July 2023 Block of the Month



4-Patch

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No "scrap" left behind

4" finished 4 1/2" unfinished

There will be two different winners this month. One for Block 1 and another for Block 2.

- Use scraps of cotton fabrics
- Make as many blocks as you want

Fabric Scraps for Block Number 1:

One small or medium size floral print. One solid white or white on white fabric. Note: If using a stripe print, make sure there is enough scrap fabric to cut the individual pieces in one direction.

Fabric Scraps for Block Number 2:

One small or medium size floral print. One solid or tone on tone matching color from the floral print. Note: If using a stripe floral print, make sure there is enough scrap fabric to cut the individual pieces in one direction.


Cutting for Both Blocks 1 and 2:

- 2 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares for block A
- 2 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares for block B

Sewing for Both Block 1 and 2:

Sew one letter A to one letter B. Then sew one letter B to one letter A. Press both seam allowances toward the floral print. Looking at the diagram, sew the two units together and press according to the arrow.

Suggestions: Cut and sew a 1" - 2" finished border around the block using scrap prints or solid color of choice if a larger block is needed in the future.

Scraps of Wisdom

Use an empty cardboard tissue box to store small scraps of fabric for future quilt blocks and projects. Better yet, mark and use several boxes to separate the fabrics by color.
