Snow on the Cabin

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
12 ½ inch unfinished 12 inch finished

Fabrics:

Use one solid or white on white geometric fabric, one snowflake or small geometric medium color gold print, one snowflake or small geometric medium color gray print, one snowflake or small geometric red color print and one snowflake or small geometric medium to dark blue print.

Note: no florals

Note: Use one solid color fabric if a snowflake or geometric print or prints are not available for the above fabric strip requirements.



Cutting:

- 1 4 ½ inch x 4 ½ square of white on white or solid for letter A
- 1 2 ½ inch x 4 ½ inch for gold rectangle for letter B 1 2 ½ inch x
- 6 ½ inch for gold rectangle for letter C
- 1 2 ½ inch x 6 ½ inch for gray rectangle for letter D
- 1 2 ½ inch x 8 ½ inch for gray rectangle for letter E
- 1 2 ½ inch x 8 ½ inch for red rectangle for letter F 1 2 ½ inch x
- 10 1/2 inch for red rectangle for letter G
- 1 2 ½ inch x 10 ½ inch for blue rectangle for letter H
- 1 2 ½ inch x 12 ½ inch for blue rectangle for letter I

Sewing:

Sew a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch gold rectangle, letter B, to the top edge of the white square, letter A. Press toward the rectangle. Sew a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, Letter C, rectangle, to the left side of the unit created. Press toward the rectangle. Continue adding the gray rectangle fabrics letters D and E, red rectangle fabrics letters F and G, and blue rectangle fabrics letters H and I until the blocks is complete. Press as the arrows indicate toward the new rectangle

Anne Marie's Scrap Tip

Instead of storing the leftover quilt scraps, after

finishing a quilt, cut them into 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ strips or strips off various widths and store in boxes labeled according to the width. The strips are ready for a future quilt block
