August 2018 Block of the Month

Pennsylvania
(Nancy Page, 1920–30)



12 ½ inches unfinished 12 inches finished

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Fabrics:

Use one very small floral or geometric print of medium color of your choice to represent a flavor of ice cream and one solid white or white on white.

Cut:

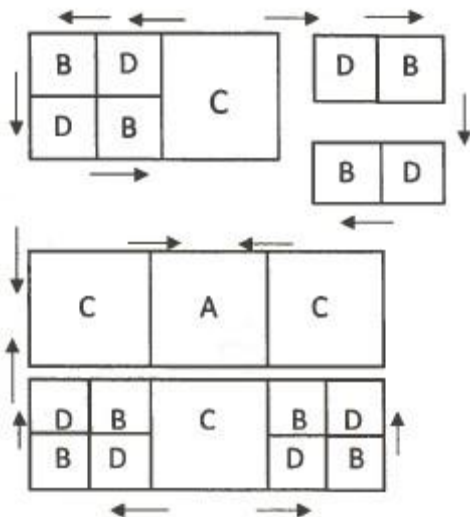
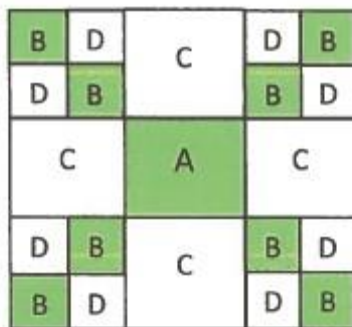
- 1 4 ½ inch square from small floral or geometric print fabric for letter A
- 8 2 ½ inch squares from small floral or geometric print fabric for letter B
- 4 4 ½ inch square from solid white or white on white for Letter C
- 8 2 ½ inches squares from solid white or white on white for letter D

Sewing:

Sew all the letter B's to letter D's and all the letter D's to letter B's and press the seams to one side according to the arrows. Sew these small units together to make the corner units and press the seams according to the arrows. Sew the corner units to letter C and press the seams toward the corner units. Sew letter A to both letter C's and press toward letter A. Sew the rows together and press the seams according to the arrows.

Suggestion:

These quilt blocks would make a wonderful baby quilt sewing three blocks across and four blocks down using narrow sashing or alternate fabric squares between the blocks for a larger quilt.



Anne Marie's Scrap Tip

Do your best to cut the outside pieces of any quilt block on the up and down/straight of grain of the fabric. This will prevent distortion when sewing the quilt blocks together for the quilt top.
